

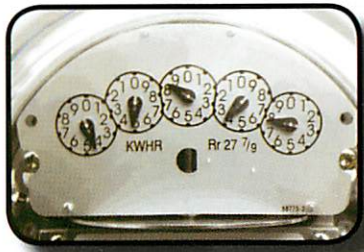
## Energy Services Outreach

## Weatherization Assistance Program



## Weatherization Works

Oakland Livingston Human Service Agency is a Community Action Agency with over 90 programs that enable the low-income, elderly and residents with disabilities in Oakland and Livingston Counties to gain the knowledge and skills to become self-sufficient. Read on to find out more about the Weatherization Assistance Program.

## What is the Weatherization Assistance Program?



The mission of Oakland Livingston Human Service Agency's Weatherization Assistance Program is to help you conserve energy and save money.

The program is federally funded by the Department of Energy and is FREE to eligible participants.

Weatherization focuses on making your home more energy efficient and identifying the most cost effective energy conservation measures to be installed.

Some energy saving measures may include:

- Home energy audits
- Insulation
- Air leakage reduction utilizing blower door technology
- Furnace repair or replacement
- Combustion appliance testing
- Smoke detectors

These measures will continue to provide energy savings for the lifetime of your home.

## Who is eligible?

There is no charge for Weatherization to those who qualify:

- Families and individuals who are interested in having their home weatherized must meet current federal income guidelines, which includes the gross income of everyone residing in the home at the time of application.
- Income is evaluated based on the last 90 days.
- Recipients of Supplemental Social Security or State Disability Assistance during any part of the past twelve months are automatically eligible.
- Applicants must be residents of Oakland or Livingston Counties.
- Weatherization is available for homeowners (including manufactured homes) and renters.



## What is the Weatherization process?

**Weatherization is not an emergency program.**

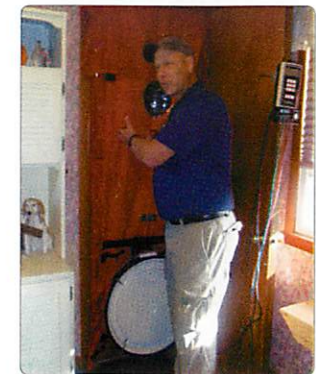
To start the process...

1. Apply for the Weatherization Assistance Program.
2. You will receive a letter of income eligibility.

**If you are eligible:**

3. OLHSA Energy Services will make a pre-inspection appointment with you and perform an energy audit on your home.
4. State licensed contractors will be scheduled to perform energy saving measures on your home.
5. After all work is completed, OLHSA will conduct a post-inspection to review the completed work.

During this process you will have the opportunity to attend an Energy Education class.
